Summary of RIMAU's activities and achievements from September 2018 - August 2019



This September 2020, RIMAU is two years old. The last 24 months has been action packed - RIMAU has been involved in discussions with government, helped spreading awareness on the plight of the Malayan tiger, collaborated with various organisations, raised funds and set up together with Perak State Park Corporation the Menraq Patrolling Unit in Royal Belum.

In the first eight months we worked closely with the Department of Wildlife and National Parks (PERHILITAN) and the Ministry of Land, Water and Natural Resources (KATS) to help with a new "Save our Malayan Tiger" national campaign. We provided Perhilitan with a campaign logo, website and video featuring Tun Siti Hasmah to help launch the movement. RIMAU was asked to help present to the Chief of Police's office and the Chief of Defence Forces. The campaign was launched by the Honourable Minister Dr Xavier Jayakumar in April 2019 on World Wildlife Day where RIMAU also had a booth. We continued to support the campaign by providing new videos to reach the Malaysian audience. RIMAU was also invited to sit on National Biodiversity Roundtable consisting of members from civil society, academia and private sector to serve as an advisor to the Ministry.



In the last two years we have collaborated with various organisations to increase the reach and to find new audiences for our message of saving the Malayan tiger. We partnered with Pantun Pins to create a limited edition tiger pin that has now become the emblem of the "Selamatkan Harimau Malaya" campaign. It was given to all members of the cabinet and worn by the Minister at all times. We partnered with the Selangor Youth Community where RIMAU was chosen as a beneficiary for the Selangor Criterium Series bicycle race and special RIMAU medals were given to the winners. We have also partnered with Little Rimba, where their mascot Chombi was given to us to use for the wall mural painted in Gerik and special mention in their restaurant menu. We have also worked with Sunway University, Rimau Racing, Rage Cafe and Lindees to raise awareness and funds.

RIMAU has celebrated two Global Tiger Days and in both occasions we have taken the approach to celebrate outside Kuala Lumpur in areas of the tiger habitat. In 2019, we took the celebration to Gerik, Perak - the gateway to tiger country. This is where many poachers stock up on supplies, equipment and food. Working with the local council, they built us a wall in the most popular recreational spot -Taman Inai - where we painted a double sided mural. During the event, HRH Sultanah of Perak, Tuanku Zara Salim and her two children completed the painting. Rimau set up exhibition panels in Malay where the locals soaked up the information and photographs on display. It was here that we pledge our first RM50,000 to the setting up of the Menrag Patrol Unit in Royal Belum.

Summary of RIMAU's activities and achievements from September 2018 - August 2019

The objective of the Menrag Patrol Unit is to enhance the protection of wildlife in Royal Belum State Park especially the Malayan Tiger by supplementing boots on the ground to carry out regular anti-poaching patrolling with Perak State Park Corporation. It will also nurture a sense of ownership in wildlife conservation within local indigenous communities in Royal Belum State Park. Menrag means people in the Jahai language. The Jahai ethnic group have made Royal Belum their home for centuries. Currently, 14 rangers have been selected and trained as the Menraq Patrol Unit from the village of Tanhain. Their graduation ceremony was held in Royal Belum during the Global Tiger Day celebrations 2020 with a special congratulatory message from HRH Sultan Nazrin.








Summary of RIMAU's activities and achievements from September 2018 - August 2019
