FOREST PATROL TEAM COORDINATOR

Persatuan Pelindung Harimau Malaysia (RIMAU) is seeking a highly motivated individual for the position of Forest Patrol Team Coordinator to be based in Gerik, Perak. The successful candidate will be experienced in rainforest conservation, knowledgeable about the plight of Malayan tigers, and have proven supervisory experience in the field. Working closely with Perak State Parks, Forestry, PERHILITAN, and other governmental bodies as needed, the Coordinator will plan, organize and oversee the activities of Orang Asli anti-poaching patrol teams in the Belum-Temenggor rainforest.

The Coordinator will report to the President of RIMAU.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Hire, train and supervise Orang Asli patrol teams whose primary goal is to protect the forest from tiger poachers
- Take steps to ensure the safety and well-being as well as the effectiveness of patrol team members
- Plan, organize and deliver training to team members and train Orang Asli team leaders to be able to lead their teams to carry out patrolling with best practices
- Lead patrols of up to two weeks
- Participate in the implementation of anti-poaching technology (such as camera traps)
- Work with personnel from local government agencies including Perak State Parks Corporation, Forestry, Perhilitan and others to coordinate anti-poaching efforts and data collection
- Assist in Orang Asli community-building related work as part of RIMAU's initiative to engage Orang Asli in tiger and forest conservation
- Participate in strategic planning, lead briefings, and make presentations to RIMAU leadership, governmental bodies and other organizations as needed.
- Produce reports on patrolling efforts, community engagement, collaborations, and other activities
- Assist in preparing patrol budgets, manage funds and provide expense reports
- Maintain a database of patrol data to be shared with RIMAU leadership and keep proper records

QUALIFICATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS

- Minimum 2 years of experience coordinating and organizing field work in forest or wildlife conservation or related field
- Knowledge of forest trekking, including safety protocols, and able to trek on multi-day missions carrying at least 15 kg
- Proven experience leading and managing teams in the field
- Must be able to communicate fluently in Bahasa Malaysia and English, write moderately well in both, and be able to present information in person and digitally
- Familiarity with organizations and policies relating to wildlife conservation in Malaysia
- Familiarity with Orang Asli communities and the challenges they face
- Degree or certificate in conservation, biology, forestry, or related discipline would be an advantage
- Personal qualities of honesty, integrity, commitment to teamwork and to RIMAU's mission
- Must be willing to be based in Gerik, Perak and willing to be on patrol in the forest for up to two weeks straight
- Malaysian citizen and driver's license required
